- Bow. *S. C. F. Nailer.*—A useful oar but rather short in body swing. Scarcely improved as much as he should have done on his last year's form.
- R. G. Bacon.*—Improved very much during the training. Uses his legs well, and swings well.
 - C. Hartnell.*—Inclined to use his arms too much. A neat oar and hard worker.
 - N. P. Morrison.*—Did not seem quite comfortable in his place, as his swing became very irregular. Uses his arms too much. Rowed much better in the Four than in the Eight.
 - A. D. H. Hickie.*—A powerful and useful oar when at his best. He had to row the Shrewsbury race under curiously uncomfortable circumstances, losing the blade of his oar in a foul. He managed to keep time so well, that no one else knew of the disaster.
 - C. de Water.*—A most useful six. Rows a powerful blade and has a long swing, though as yet it is not very steady. Much improved this season.
 - W. P. Rogers.*—A hard worker, but not a very good time-keeper, as he has not sufficient control of his body swing.
- Stk. *F. Fitzgerald-Moore.*—Rows a lively stroke and can keep his crew going very well. Has not quite learnt the knack of getting his crew together, but if his crew is beaten it is usually not his fault.
- Cox. *E. Koenig.*—In the Shrewsbury race kept his head in an emergency and did very well in keeping his boat out of the bank. In the Town Regatta he did not steer so well.
