

FROM INDIA.

An O.B. in the 4th Cavalry writes (from Srinagar, Kashmir).

We [the 4th B.C.] are stationed at Allaha-bad, not a bad spot on the whole [? not at All-a-ha-bad—Ed.] In the cold weather, when we are not worried by manœuvres, it is delightful, but in the hot it's beastly, as we are between two rivers which makes it muggy. But we have got pigsticking, which is something to be thankful for, as one can't get it in the Punjab. All our meets are about 40 miles away; we start from the station some time on a Friday by train, arrive at the place that night, pigstick Saturday, and get back by Sunday night when we have to march our horses out. It's a clinking good game, keeps you so fit, and is something to occupy one's mind. . . We get very good Polo, as it is a big station. I hope to be in the Polo team this year. Just now I am up in Kashmir . . . it's a delightful place, a lovely valley, with a circle of snow mountains all round. It's very nice coming here to see everything cool and green after the dust and heat of the plains . . .'

The annual prize meeting of the Beds. Rifle Association was held on Saturday, June 23rd, at Millbrook. Sapper G. L. Ritchie made top score 29-28-31=88, Sergt. A. D.

Gordon was 2nd with 29-31-28=88. Corpl. Columbine and Corpl. Miller made 85 each.

Concurrently with the above was held the fourth and final shoot for the County Bronze and Recruits' Medals. In the former Major Columbine tied with two others for top place with 273, but as all three have won the medal in former years, and as the medal cannot be held twice by the same person, it passed to Sergt. Gordon who was fourth with 267, Corpl. Columbine being fifth with 265. If the top scorer has won the medal before, he receives a bar instead. The three who tied, therefore, shot off three tie shots at 600 yds. for this bar on Saturday the 30th, Major Columbine winning with 5-5-3=13 against 5-3-3=11.

The Recruits' medal was won by Sapper G. L. Ritchie with 262 points, Sapper Radice being 2nd with 248.

The Revolver medal was won by Sapper Kellie with a good score of 38 out of a possible 42.
