We beat the M.C.C. for the first time since 1900. The win recalled one of the best performances in Bedford cricket of late years, when, thanks to F. G. Brooks, B. L. and C. L. K. Peel we got 200 odd runs in less than two hours and won just on the stroke of five.

The present victory, though not so sensational, was distinctly creditable. Certainly, the M.C.C. side was weak both in batting and fielding, but they possessed in Brown and Geeson two useful professional bowlers.

Our best batting was done by Atkinson, Deal and Gouldsbury. Atkinson is evidently back in his best form and was out unluckily. Deal, except for a few wild swings at Brown, played capital cricket and now hits the ball hard. Before lunch Gouldsbury batted extremely well, picking the right ball to hit and hitting it cleanly. After lunch he never settled down, and made some painful strokes before getting out.

Our fielding was, on the whole, up to the mark. Smith and Deal made good catches and Fewings caught a very fine one. Sutherland, Atkinson and Wilkinson did excellent work.

Deal's bowling, though somewhat flattered by the weakness of the M.C.C. batting, was very successful: his analysis during his second spell must have been extremely good. Moberly also did well, though he did not appear to us to bowl as good a length as usual. Smith was erratic.
