Bisley.

After the appalling weather of Henley Week we faced the prospect of sleeping under canvas at Bisley with some trepidation. However, our fears were not realised. The weather changed and became brilliantly fine for all the three days. Indeed on the Tuesday afternoon it was really too hot to be comfortable. Otherwise the conditions for our practice shoot in the "Gale and Polden" competition were excellent. Our shooting at 200 yards, except for a 31 by Tebbs, was moderate, but in the afternoon some excellent scores were made at 500 yards, Tebbs, Sharman, and Edgecombe particularly doing well.

On the following day in the Ashburton Shield Competition our shooting at 20 yards was a great improvement on anything we had done before. A score of 226 was quite satisfactory and placed us well up the list. After lunch the conditions were rather more difficult, as there was a good deal of haze and a rather tricky wind. Our first pair made a poor start and with the exception of Mills the team never recovered from it. An aggregate of 416, though our highest match score of the season, only enabled us to tie for 42nd place out of 59 schools. The Shield was won by Lancing with a score of 478, four points more than Repton, who had led the field at lunch by 7 points. These two schools happened to shoot next to us during the afternoon and we were thus able to watch the close struggle between them. It is to be hoped that our own team were duly impressed by the coolness of their shooting when so much was depending upon it. Meanwhile the Cadet pair had been shooting well, Edgecombe's score at the longer range being very creditable. With a score of 114 they tied for 6th place out of 48 schools, the winners
